As we continue as a community to navigate through the challenges brought on by the pandemic, the Department of Public Safety's commitment to the health and safety of the Columbia community remains as strong as ever. Whether you have returned to campus this fall or are continuing to live, learn, and work remotely, the Department of Public Safety is here to support you 24/7/365. As we begin a fall term that is unlike any other, please take a moment to read about some important Public Safety resources that are available to you.

GETTING AROUND SAFELY- Over the summer, Columbia Transportation and Public Safety partnered with <u>Via</u> to transition the <u>Evening Shuttle</u> to an on-demand, point-to-point service. The app-based rideshare system provides a new and improved safe, convenient and free transportation service for Columbia affiliates beginning at 4 p.m. during the academic year (6 p.m. start during the summer) and running until 4 a.m. <u>Learn more</u>.

Other existing resources available for traveling safely around campus include the <u>Intercampus Shuttle</u>, the neighborhood merchants serving as <u>Safe Havens</u>, and <u>Blue Light Emergency Call Boxes</u> placed in various locations. SAFETY AWARENESS- Safety and security information on <u>crime prevention</u> and training including a list of <u>personal safety tips</u> in various situations are provided to students, staff, and faculty through bulletins, crime alerts, and a crime prevention newsletter as well as the <u>Public Safety Facebook page</u>.

CONNECTING WITH US- A new Public Safety resource available beginning this semester is Lion Safe, a user-friendly app available for your iOS and Android devices that makes all of Public Safety's services available at the tap of your finger. The app allows users to request emergency services at the touch of a button along with other useful quick links including maps, shuttle schedules, crime alerts, emergency protocols, and non-emergency numbers for each campus. It can be downloaded for free from the App Store or through Google Play by searching "Lion Safe Columbia University" <u>Learn more</u>.
