

Clery Crime Alert

Arsons

Columbia University Public Safety was informed of three arson incidents that occurred at the Broadway Residence Hall on the Morningside Campus. The FDNY has recently determined these fires were intentionally set. The first incident occurred on April 2, 2026, at 2:45 AM. The second and third incidents occurred on April 3, 2026, at 2:00 AM. All three incidents occurred inside garbage cans on the fourth floor in the common bathrooms. No injuries or major damage were reported. All three incidents are currently under investigation by the FDNY and CU Public Safety.

Harm Reduction Strategies:

- No one is ever responsible for a crime committed against them. The responsibility lies entirely with the perpetrator. If something happens, we encourage you to report it. Reporting helps protect others and ensures you can access support and services. Report the incident to the Department of Public Safety at

- Often, where there is smoke, there is fire. When you see or smell smoke, call 911 and report the incident to CU Public Safety immediately, stating that you see or smell smoke/fire.
- Do not try to extinguish an uncontrolled fire yourself as this can often result in further injury.
- Remember, do not assume a fire alarm is a drill or test. All building alarm systems are tested as required by law, but these tests are announced in advance. Treat every alarm as an emergency unless you have received advance notification stating otherwise.
- Exit the building immediately. Feel doors before opening them to be sure that there is no fire danger on the other side. If you must enter a smoke-filled room or hallway, cover your nose and mouth with a wet cloth and crawl, keeping your head near the floor, to the nearest exit.
